• **Doctor of Philosophy in International Commerce | 국제통상학 박사 (국제통상 전공)**

The doctoral program in international commerce combines economic and business theories with quantitative and econometric methods to address real-world challenges. This holistic approach provides students with a deep understanding of international economics, business, and finance. The research topics are not limited to traditional international economics and business subjects such as Free Trade Agreements (FTA), World Trade Organization (WTO) structures, trade conflict resolutions, the international economic aspects of climate change, foreign aids, Foreign Direct Investment (FDI), and international portfolio investment. They also encompass the impact of emerging technologies (AI, robotics, e-commerce), international marketing, e-business, international labor markets, as well as open macroeconomics. The doctoral graduates will be equipped with empirical analysis capabilities and positioned to pursue careers as international commerce issue experts and data analysis specialists in various fields, including academia, economic and business research institutes, international organizations, and private sectors.

Situated in the heart of the Asia-Pacific region, the Republic of Korea has long played a pivotal role in shaping and responding to significant developments in international relations. Qualification Exam 박사학위청구논문자격시험

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- ◆ In order to request for thesis evaluation, students **MUST** pass the Qualification Exam: General Exam.
- ◆ You have **3 chances in total** to take the General Exam.

1) Requirements for the General Exam

- ① Must be completed in your 3rd Semester or later within 10 years of admission.
- ② At least 27 credits completed by the end of the 3rd Semester.
- ③ Accumulative average GPA of 3.0 or higher
- ④ Completed all CORE Courses.

* If you do not meet any of requirements above, you are not be eligible to take the General Exam and submit your thesis until you meet all requirements above. You will automatically be extending to an extra semester.

- ◆ (Students admitted from FALL Semester 2024): **No Language (English & 2nd Foreign Language) Exam.**



(Students Admitted from 24-2) The comprehensive examination for the doctoral program assesses basic knowledge in the student's field of expertise.

1. Students will develop three possible questions with their advisor based on readings pertinent to their dissertation proposal. The student advisor selects one of them, synthesizes two or more into a single question, or creates a new one.
2. The duration of the exam shall be determined by the student and advisor, but shall not be less than three hours or more than one week. If deemed necessary by the advisor, an oral exam not to exceed two hours may be administered.
3. The exam shall be evaluated by at least two faculty members.
